Sustainability : Development of a school page on the Tamworth Sports Council Website has improved the management of inter-school competition and ensured that the school is aware of all inter-school competition opportunities.
Fund review of PE curriculum with John l'Anson £500	-Ensure that the curriculum at Three Peaks effectively engages pupils in developing a love of sport and physical activity. -Improve the development of games skills across both Key Stages.	Review of curriculum completed by newly appointed PE Subject Lead and Headteacher over 2 days. Adaptations made to the school curriculum in light of the review and shared with staff. Sustainability : Revised school curriculum has a clearer development of skills and will, over time, have an improved method of assessing and tracking pupils' progress.
Contribute towards cost of swimming provision to increase the number of children able to swim 25m. £1000	-Increase the number of pupils able to swim 25m at the end of KS2. -Provide additional teaching support for swimming.	An additional member of staff was included in the swimming teaching on a weekly basis. This meant that children could be taught in smaller groups and that those with little or no swimming experience were able to access more time with the qualified swimming teacher supplied by the School Swimming Service. The number of children able to swim 25m increased on previous years. Sustainability : The additional adults involved in swimming worked closely with the qualified swimming instructor developing skills in the teaching and development of swimming.
Fund professional development activities to improve the development of games based skills across KS1 and 2. £1,000	-Improve the quality of teaching in PE. -Improved outcomes for pupils in PE	Staff have benefitted from having opportunities to teach games based activities with the PE Subject Leader, Headteacher and visiting sports coaches from Aston Villa and Wasps Rugby Club. Sustainability: Staff's increased knowledge and the developed confidence in teaching games activities will improve teaching in the future. Teachers have indicated that working with the Subject Leader, Headteacher and visiting coaches has increased their confidence and skill.
Subsidise extra-curriculum sporting provision £2000	-Provide access to a wider range of sporting activities. Increased participation in Sporting extra-curricular activities.	The school subsidised a number of extra-curricular sporting clubs including gymnastics, basic skills, football and Tag Rugby .The school also subsidised two visits to Villa Park to take place in Football Development Days organised by

Funding provided transport for three football tournaments, two Tag Rugby tournaments, a swimming gala, cross-country races and rounders tournament. CET Day of Sport was transferred to Three Peaks thus reducing the cost of transporting children.</p>

The Val Sabin teaching resources were updated and supplemented providing teachers with guidance lesson plans for each unit and guidance on specific skill developments.</p> <p>Sustainability: Teaching guidance provides all staff with clear skill development guidance and will facilitate the children to build on skill development.</p>
<p>Train and implement Junior sports Leaders in KS2. £500</p>	<p>-Enhance playtime sporting provision. -Train pupils to lead children in games play -Enhance overall sporting ability.</p>	<p>Lunchtime supervisors received introductory training to the Positive Play resources and used this to initiate games on the playground. Children from Year 6 were taught how to play games and then ran activities for children in KS1 and EYFS. Games had a sports background and help to develop basic skills.</p> <p>Sustainability : Lunchtime Supervisors trained in initiating and leading games which will have an impact on children's experience of playtimes, their active engagement in physical and sports based activities and in teamwork and sportsmanship activities.</p>

The impact of developing the honours system was its role in encouraging children to put themselves forward to participate in inter-school competition. All children representing the school received certificates and enamel bar badges. A display of honours was also established.</p>

<p>Organisation of the Trust Day of Sport £500</p>	<p>-Host an inter-school sports festival to engage children from 4 primary schools across the country in a range of sporting competition.</p>	<p>Although CET funded the transportation of the children from our partner academies and the trophies/medals the school invested in a PA system and gazebos to establish a high quality sporting festival. The Day of Sport allowed all Year 6 and half of Year 5 children to participate in inter-school competition. Sustainability: The school now has the facilities and infrastructure to hold high quality inter-school and intra-school competition. Several children had their first experience of sporting competition and have expressed an interest in taking part in other activities.</p>
<p>Organisation of Rio Week to celebrate the 2016 Rio Olympic and Paralympic Games. £500</p>	<p>-All children in school participate in intra-school competition. -Children develop an interest in a global sporting event.</p>	<p>Each class took on the identity of a different Olympic Nation and took part in a series of sporting competitions. Skills were developed in PE sessions and then these skills were transferred into inter-class competitions in a range of team and individual sporting competition. All children participated in the activities which also included health related activities. The event culminated in the annual Sports Day which involved both competitive and non-competitive sporting activities. Sustainability : The format for a sporting week has been established and can be built on in the future. Children have expressed that they want to make this an annual event. All children in school have experienced what it is like to participate in competitive activity and developed their awareness of the health benefits of sporting activity.</p>
<p>Support for the school sponsored event for Cancer Research UK, where the children were challenged to run from John O’Groats to Lands End. £200</p>	<p>-To develop the children’s understanding of the health benefits of physical activity. -To develop an appreciation of the role sport can play in bringing together communities</p>	<p>The sponsored walk was a huge success. All children engaged in a week-long series of sponsored walks and runs which culminated in a family fun run to raise money for Cancer Research UK. Children participated in discussions about why they were participating in the activities and the importance of exercise in developing a healthy lifestyle.</p>
