

Three Peaks Primary Academy PE and Sport Premium Strategy

Purpose of the premium

The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

The Secretary of State does not consider the following expenditure as falling within the scope of additional or sustainable improvement:

- Employing coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements – these should come out of schools' core staffing budgets.
- Teaching the minimum requirements of the existing PE curriculum.

Overview of the Three Peaks Primary Academy strategies for improving pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment and giving pupils the opportunity to develop a healthy, active lifestyle

We spend our PE and sport funding in the following ways to improve PE and sport participation and to enable pupils to develop a healthy, active lifestyle:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the schools as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sport and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Our rationale for spending the money in this way is:

“All pupils leaving primary school to be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.” The DfE vision “Physical Literacy can be described as the motivation, confidence, physical competence, knowledge and understanding that provides children with the movement foundation for lifelong participation in physical activity. Enabling them to be physically literate supports their development as competent, confident and healthy movers.” Primary School Physical Literacy Framework, developed by Youth Sport Trust, Sport England, County Sport Partnership Network, Association of Physical Education and Sports Coach UK.

How the improvements made will be sustainable in the future :

- Increased knowledge and skills of all staff members
- Strong links formed with local community clubs
- Strong links established with local Primary and Secondary Schools
