School re-starts on the 8 March 2021

It is the Government intention that all year groups will return to school full time.



Returning to school is vital for children's education and to support their wellbeing.



Each school will have their own arrangements. Heads will consider individual school circumstances.

Key Information and Messages

Listed below is the key information from the video to be posted by Mr Penn-Bourton on the plans for re-opening the school to all year groups on 8 March 2021. The information is broken into 4 key areas :

- Containing the Virus
- Minimising contact between individuals and social distancing
- Hygiene
- Engaging in Track and Trace

Containing the Virus



No child should attend school if they or any member of their household have coronavirus (COVID-19) or symptoms of it.



New or persistent cough.



High temperature



Change or loss of normal sense of taste or smell

Hygiene



Children will frequently wash their hands using running water and soap or hand sanitiser.



CATCH IT.



BIN IT.



KILL IT.

We will promote good respiratory hygiene by teaching children to follow 'the catch it, bin it and kill it' approach.



Face coverings should not be worn in school.

Parents/Carers may decide to wear face coverings when dropping off and picking up children.



School will continue to have an additional cleaner on site during the school day cleaning toilets and frequently touched areas more regularly.

Children will continue to take a role wiping their tables with antibacterial wipes at the end of each session

Enhanced cleaning procedures will continue before and after school.

In the Classroom

- ✓ All tables in KS1 and KS2 set in rows facing the front of the class.
- ✓ All children in KS1 and 2 will sit side by side.
- ✓ Where possible, staff will remain 2m from pupils, when this is not possible, staff will limit the time they are in closer proximity.
- ✓ Adaptations made to the EYFS classrooms.



Out the Classroom

- ✓ Virtual assemblies
- ✓ Limited movement within school buildings
- ✓ Separate staffrooms (EYFS, Y1, Y2-4, Y5/6)
- ✓ Music Room, MFL Room and Changing Rooms not used.
- ✓ Whenever possible PE will be taught outside.
- ✓ Dedicated bathrooms for each bubble.



Minimising Contact Between Individuals and Maintaining Social Distancing



- ✓ All children (with exception of Nursery) will start at the same time. Doors will open at 8:45am and close at 9:00am.
- ✓ Reception and KS 1 pupils will finish at 3:15pm.
- ✓ KS 2 pupils will finish at 3:25pm
- ✓ Any pupil arriving late must wait outside the school main reception (under the canopy) until greeted by a member of staff.

Arriving / Leaving



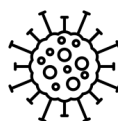
- ✓ Pupils **will** need :
 - A bag
 - A water bottle (filled with water only)
 - A lunchbox (if they are having a packed lunch)
- ✓ To bring their school pencil cases back
- Pupils **will not** need :
 - Hand Sanitiser
- ✓ PE Kits—Pupils should come to school in PE kit on days they have PE (tracksuits are ok)

Engaging in Track and Trace



We require that all parents are ready and willing to book a test if they or their children display symptoms.

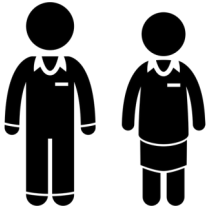


School will ask parents to inform us immediately of test results and self-isolate if they are positive or if they are in close contact with someone who tests positive or develops symptoms .



School will ask parents to engage fully with NHS Test and Trace

Uniform



The usual school uniform policy will be in place from the full re-opening.

PE kit needs to be worn on the days that children have PE. Tracksuits, jogging bottoms or leggings can be worn on these days along with trainers but please remember that many PE lessons will be outdoor.

Please remember classrooms will be ventilated, windows will open.

Dinners

Children can either bring a packed lunch or have the school dinner option. Aspens, our catering provider, have worked hard to ensure that the meals they provide are of the usually high standard.



Home Learning

- ✓ In the event of any future school closure or absence due to self isolating, the school will ensure that work is available for pupils to do at home.
- ✓ This work will utilise resources from Oak National Academy and will fit with our curriculum at Three Peaks.
- ✓ Pupils will continue to have access to staff at school through the use of Tapestry (EYFS) E-mail (All Years) and Microsoft Teams (Y1-6)
- ✓ Interactive resources such as TT Rockstars and Sumdog will continue to be available to all.
